# **Citizen Budget Engagement Tool**

As part of Council's ongoing commitment to transparency and engaging with residents, the Town of View Royal is inviting you to provide your input and voice your opinions on the annual budget prior to final adoption of the 2024-2028 Financial Plan (the Plan) using the Citizen Budget engagement tool (Citizen Budget).

Citizen Budget allows participants to enter their property value and allocate their personal tax bill across the various municipal departments. It demonstrates how the choices you make in each area could affect your tax bill if those changes were implemented and also suggests some of the potential implications your changes could have for the affected services.

### Why get involved with Citizen Budget?

- Get an estimate of the municipal portion of your 2024 property taxes, based on the proposed financial plan currently being considered by View Royal Council;
- Become better informed about the services funded by your property taxes and user fees;
- Give feedback to View Royal Council about the services the Town provides;
- Influence the allocation of limited public resources to the services that matter most to you!

Heat pumps are the most efficient and climate-friendly heating and cooling system on the market today. Switching to an electric heat pump provides year-round comfort, better indoor air quality, and produces 97% less greenhouse gas emissions than natural gas/oil heating AND you could save 40-75% on your annual heating bill if converting from oil to an electric heat pump!

In addition to the heat pump rebates available through the CleanBC Better Homes and Home Renovation Rebate Program, the Town of View Royal



offers a \$350 municipal top-up to participants that switch from a fossil fuel (oil, natural gas, or propane) heating system to an electric air source heat pump.

# Capital West Accessibility Advisory Committee - Accessibility & You Survey

Seven municipalities in the centre and western part of the Capital Regional District – Colwood, Esquimalt, Highlands, Langford, Metchosin, Sooke, and View Royal – have partnered to form the Capital West Accessibility Advisory Committee and to prepare a joint



Accessibility Plan (the "Plan"). The purpose of the Plan is to identify, remove, and prevent barriers to individuals in or interacting with the partner municipalities.

The Plan will be informed, in part, by the Accessibility & You survey (the Survey) as well as partially by facilitated public engagement sessions. The Survey is completely anonymous and will only be reported back as a summary of feedback. It is estimated to be completed in 10-15 minutes or less.

#### **View Royal Council Awards Grant to Recruit Physician**

View Royal Council committed to help address the shortage of maternity and primary care physicians in the Town with a \$30,000 grant to the Westshore Primary Care Society (WPCS) for the rapid recruitment of a foreign-trained physician.

The funds will assist GROW Health, a View Royal family practice and maternity clinic that has lost three family physicians since 2022, to increase its patient care capacity. The clinic operates as a non-profit by WPCS.

"The shortage of primary care physicians is one of the greatest challenges facing residents of our town and region," said Mayor Sid Tobias. "Community wellness is a town priority and with many of our residents now lacking prenatal and primary care, Council is proud to respond to WPCS's request for funds to recruit a new physician."

Until 2022, GROW Health had nine family physicians serving 7,200 patients, many of whom were orphaned with the loss of three doctors.

"The importance of recruiting family doctors cannot be overstated," said WPCS president, Dr. Spencer Cleave. "It has become a regular occurrence that women are delivering babies with no prenatal care and hundreds of patients, many of them in View Royal, are now without a family doctor. We are grateful to View Royal for recognizing and helping address the urgent need."

The grant to WPCS is one of several grants in aid View Royal Council awarded to not-for-profit organizations. Others include the School District 61 crossing guard program for up to \$50,000, \$7,500 for LifeCycles Project Society, \$3,000 for View Royal Out of School Care Society, \$3,000 for Victoria Sexual Assault Centre, \$2,500 for Vancouver Island South Film and Media Commission, \$2,000 for Juan de Fuca Performing Arts Society, \$725 for Relmagine West Shore Community Society, \$500 each for Capital Region Food and Agriculture Initiatives Roundtable, View Royal Elementary School PAC, and Victoria Brain Injury Society, and \$250 for Access West Shore Society.
