## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### When do I require a dog licence and what is the cost?

All dogs require a licence at four months of age. The cost of a licence is as follows:

Spayed or neutered	\$25.00
Non-Neutered/Spayed	\$45.00
Late Penalty Fee (after March 1st)	\$10.00
Replacement Tag Fee	\$5.00

\*\* A free tag is offered if you apply for a licence within 12 months of spaying or neutering your dog (with proof from vet).

### Where can I purchase a dog licence?

Dog licences are available at the Town Hall (45 View Royal Ave.) and from any authorized dog licence vendor for the CRD.

### How long is the licence valid?

The tag is valid for the calendar year from January 1st to December 31st.

### Does my dog need to wear the licence?

Yes. If your dog gets lost and is picked up by CRD Animal Control or is in an accident, the tag will allow the authorities to contact you.

### Who do I contact for my animal issues including excessive dog barking?

### If I wanted to adopt a dog, where would I go?

The CRD Animal Shelter is located at 5401 Pat Bay Highway and is open Monday to Saturday 9:30 am to 4:30pm. You can reach them by phone at 250-658-5745.

### When a dog defecates on a boulevard or in a park, is the owner required to remove it?

Yes. The Bylaw requires the owner to remove it.



### What is a dangerous dog?

A dangerous dog is a dog that has killed or injured a person or animal, has aggressively pursued or harassed a person without provocation, or is specifically bred or trained for fighting purposes. There are special restrictions that apply to dangerous dogs, most notably the requirement to be muzzled at all times when in public.

### Is my dog required to be on a leash?

Yes. All dogs, when in public, must be on a leash except in designated off-leash areas. Dogs found running at large are subject to impoundment.



## IMPOUND FEES

### For a licenced dog:

- First Impoundment \$ 75.00
- Second Impoundment \$100.00
- Third Impoundment \$150.00

### For a dangerous dog:

- First Impoundment \$ 100.00
- Second Impoundment \$ 250.00
- Third and subsequent Impoundments \$ 500.00
