2017 Property Taxes



Property taxes are due **Tuesday, July 4, 2017**. As of 12:01am, July 5, 2017, any unpaid 2017 property taxes or unclaimed 2017 Home Owner Grants will have a 10% penalty added to the outstanding balance.

There are many payment options available: in person or the drop box at Town Hall, mail and internet or telephone banking. The Town also has a program for property owners to pre-pay their annual property taxes.

Accepted Payment Methods – Cheques, Cash and Debit Cards. If paying by Debit Card, you may be required to increase your daily security limit through your bank. Post dated cheques for July 4, 2017 are accepted. The Town of View Royal does not accept credit card payments, wire transfers or third party cheques.

Home Owner Grant (HOG) – Don't forget to claim your HOG. Unclaimed HOG's will receive a 10% penalty as at 12:01 am on July 5, 2017. The HOG form is the detachable bottom portion of your tax notice. Completed forms can be dropped off at Town Hall in person or by using the after hours drop box located by the front doors, mailed in, or claimed online by going to our website www.viewroyal.ca.

Property Tax Prepayment Plan

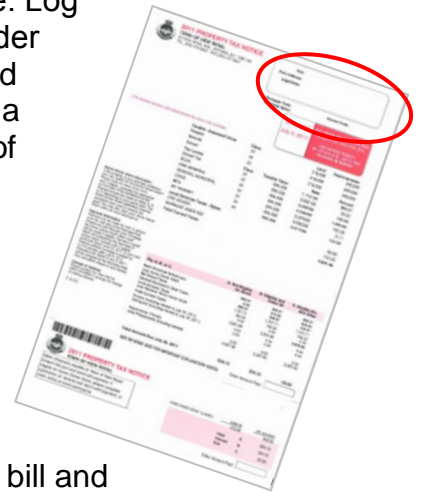
The Town of View Royal has a program for property owners to pre-pay their annual property taxes.

It is an optional payment plan that provides an opportunity for taxpayers to make 10 equal monthly pre-payments for the following year’s estimated property taxes.

Property Taxes at Your Finger Tips

The following online services are accessible from the Town’s website. Log onto www.viewroyal.ca and then click on “Online Services” found under QUICKLINKS on the right hand side of the home page. You will need your Roll Number (excluding the 401 or 402) and Access Code from a current or previous year’s property tax notice (top right-hand corner of tax notice - see image).



1. Access your Property Tax Assessment and Billing information:
 - View the last three years assessment values for your property;
 - Review the property tax bills charged to your property for the last six years;
 - Review the individual transactions of your annual property tax bill and tax payments;
 - Check to ensure you claimed your homeowner grants.

2. Apply for a Home Owner Grant (once you have received your tax notice):

Fill out the online application form to claim your Home Owner Grant.

Tour de Rock 2017

David Brown – View Royal Fire Rescue

David Brown has been a volunteer firefighter with View Royal Fire Rescue since 2003. On May 5, 2017 David was named as one of 24 police officers, firefighters and paramedics participating in the 20th edition of the Cops for Cancer Tour de Rock (The Tour de Rock).

The Tour de Rock team cycles from one end of Vancouver Island to the other, covering 1,000 kilometers and visiting more than 27 communities along the way.

David is riding the Tour and raising funds to support children like Marley, his junior rider. Marley is now 4 years old and was diagnosed with leukemia at age 3. She has endured radiation therapy, chemotherapy and a bone marrow transplant in order to win her battle with leukemia.

To date, the Tour de Rock has raised over \$20 million to support kids and their families who are dealing with pediatric cancers. The money donated is used to fund research into life-saving treatments that increase the odds of children surviving their battle with pediatric cancer. Donations also support Camp Goodtimes, a place where Island children dealing with cancer can go to be a kid again, free from the stress of their illness.
