From The Mayor's Desk

Dear Friends and Neighbours,

As a new mayor I have been very proud to represent the Town at the regional, provincial, and federal levels and have had some excellent occasions in the past six months to do so. From opening the new Victoria Scottish Community

Centre to the first Black-led daycare in British Columbia, it is clear we have much to be proud of. I am in awe of the hard work and selfless dedication of resident volunteers who want to make their community a better place. The Westshore mayors have also seen great opportunities to build on areas of mutual interests, meeting regularly to discuss these.

View Royal Council's highest goal is to maintain and enhance the quality of life for all residents of the Town. As elected officials, we are responsible for making decisions concerning policy and bylaws implemented by the Town's highly qualified staff. The new council had two additional members when we were sworn in, in the Fall. I am very pleased at how much we have accomplished and I am confident of many achievements to come. There is a great sense of teamwork and collaboration.

There were contentious issues such as the funding of elementary school crossing guards and the decision to remain with the 2011 Official Community Plan for the time being as it continues to offer a sustainable development plan that provides protection for the environment, infrastructure, and safety. Over the coming months, Council will explore improved ways to increase public engagement from all parts of the Town to ensure that we are informed by your opinions and the data required to make sound decisions about our collective future.

Council has gone through the Town's budget line-by-line to ensure we can control costs associated with the unprecedented growth period and inflationary pressures. As your representative at the Capital Region District, I have worked very hard to keep tax increases under the level of inflation. I am very pleased that the Town will be receiving \$4.6 million through the Provincial Government's Growing Communities Fund. This funding will assist in delivering infrastructure to make View Royal safer, more resilient, and better connected.

Over the next few months, we will be calling out for new opportunities for advisory committees as they are restructured to better represent this diverse community in areas of specific concern. If you are interested in an important position on an advisory committee such as Arts and Culture, Parks and Recreation, Transportation, Planning and Engagement, or the Environment, please reach out by email and I will alert you when the intake process is open. Council needs your support and involvement to make the best decisions. As well, stay tuned as we engage all neighbourhoods in reviewing the Official Community Plan.

DRAFT ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION NETWORK PLAN

The Town's staff and consultant presented the draft **Active Transportation Network Plan (ATNP)** to the community in an open house held April 3, 2023 at Town Hall. The ATNP will supplement the Town's Transportation Master Plan by emphasizing greener and human-powered modes of transportation. Once complete, the ATNP will act as a tool to guide View

Royal towards promoting multi-modal transportation methods across the Town.

The draft plan includes feedback received in previous rounds of engagement. The open house provided a final opportunity for the community to offer feedback on the final document.

The Town of View Royal will be celebrating Earth Day by hosting its **FIRST-EVER** Resident Tree Planting event!

On Saturday, April 22, residents of View Royal who applied to participate in the Town's Resident Tree Planting Program in 2022 will meet staff at Town Hall to pick up trees to be planted on their properties. The inaugural event will see numerous trees distributed to the community with the hope of providing many more trees to be planted in association with upcoming planting events.

What is the Resident Tree Planting Program?

This program encourages residents to contribute to View Royal's urban canopy by providing native species of trees to residents to plant on their private property. Twice annually, the Town will review applications and purchase trees from a local nursery to be picked up at Town Hall by community members during the next tree planting event (seasonally, in the spring and fall).

2023 PROPERTY TAXES

REMINDER HOME OWNER GRANT

Applications must be received by the Province on or before **July 4, 2023** to avoid penalties. To claim your home owner grant go to www.gov.bc.ca/homeownergrant or phone 1-888-355-2700.

2023 PROPERTY TAXES DUE TUESDAY, JULY 4, 2023

Property tax notices will be issued to property owners in the last week of May 2023. Any unpaid 2023 property taxes or unclaimed 2023 home owner grants as of 12:01am July 5, 2023 will have a 10% penalty added to the outstanding balance. As the penalty is Provincially legislated, there are NO exceptions.

PROPERTY TAX DEFERMENT

PROVINCIAL TAX DEFERMENT PROGRAM:

You may qualify if you are 55 years of age or older, a surviving spouse, or a disabled person as defined by regulation, or financially supporting a dependent child under the age of 18. For details go to www.gov.bc.ca/propertytaxdeferment or phone 1-888-355-2700. Only your current year's taxes may be deferred. You must pay your garbage user fees or property taxes owing from a prior year (if applicable) before you can defer your current year's taxes.

If you have not already done so, be sure to sign up before May 1, 2023 to get your 2023 Property Tax Notice by email as soon as it is issued. If you sign up for this service, you will not receive a paper copy in the mail.

HEAT YOUR FOOD NOT THE PLANET!


Cooking with an electric or induction cooktop protects your family from harmful indoor air pollutants and potential methane leaks at the fittings and connections associated with gas stoves.

Induction cooktops:

- · save you money as they are very energy efficient;
- cook food very quickly;
- · clean up with a wipe;
- · produce no noxious fumes; and
- will not catch objects, like dishcloths, on fire as they only heat items that contain iron particles, not the cooktop.

If you are not yet ready to replace your gas stove, a portable induction cooktop can help you stop burning fossil fuels in your home when you cook. You can find induction cooktops starting at under \$100. Your lungs will love you for it!

WESTSHORE PUBLIC ALERT NOTIFICATION SYSTEM (PANS)

Sign up now to receive public safety alerts – it only takes a few minutes

In the case of a public safety incident, the Westshore Public Alert Notification System (PANS) will be used to deliver critical and potentially life-saving alerts to residents who have registered. This information can help you and your family know what to do, where to go, and what to expect. Sign up to receive critical alerts for major emergencies and disasters (ie. tsunami, earthquake, wildfire) and/or lower severity alerts (ie. traffic, weather). You can also choose to receive notifications for more than one location such as your home, office, cottage, family, friends, etc.

Notifications can be received by:

- · Home, cell, or work phone
- Email
- SMS Text Message
- Smartphone app
- Social media and more

VIEW ROYAL THINKS GLOBALLY ACTS LOCALLY

View Royal Council voted unanimously to endorse the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty (FFNPT), joining the growing number of communities globally advocating to prevent the expansion of coal, oil, and gas by ending all new exploration and production. Just as nuclear free cities played a critical role in calling for the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons, councils around the world can help build momentum towards a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty.

BC ENERGY STEP CODE

The Town is committed to taking steps to increase energy-efficiency in new buildings. On January 1, 2023, the Town implemented BC Energy Step Code 3 for Part 9 Buildings (single-family dwellings, duplexes, and townhouses) and wood frame buildings consisting of six-storeys or less regulated by the Part 3 of the BC Building Code, and Step Code 2 for Part 3 Buildings (other residential and commercial buildings). This change does not affect existing in-stream development applications (development permits and building permits) that were received prior to January 1, 2023.

Through the BC Energy Step Code, the Province has established a series of performance requirements that will increase energy efficiency of newly constructed buildings. The Province's goal is that all new buildings are net-zero energy-ready by 2032, which is being achieved through a set of incremental Step Code levels.

These changes at the Provincial level align with View Royal's commitment to reduce energy use and emissions in buildings, identified in the Town's Official Community Plan and the recently adopted Community Climate Action Strategy.
