



Active Transportation Network Quick Facts

- The Town of View Royal maintains approximately 50km of roads, 25km of sidewalks, and 15km of bike lanes. The Town is also home to approximately 7.5km of the Capital Regional District's regional trail network.
- According to the Capital Regional District's 2017 Origin-Destination Household Travel Survey, from 2011 to 2017, the Town's overall active transportation mode share (walking, cycling, transit) increased for all trips, particularly for trips within the Town growing from 34 percent in 2011 to 39 percent in 2017.
- According to 2016 Statistics Canada, the total percentage of commute trips by active travel (walk, cycle, transit) is 19 percent, which is lower than the average (32 percent) among the core municipalities in the Capital Region including Esquimalt, Oak Bay, Saanich, and Victoria.
- According to the 2020 Housing and Transportation Cost Estimate Study by the Capital Regional District, after Oak Bay and Saanich, View Royal has the highest vehicles per household among all core municipalities at 1.54 vehicles per household. The average annual household transportation cost is \$11,808, which is above the average among the core municipalities in the Capital Region at \$10,573.
